Camp Lincoln 10 will no longer have regular scheduled meetings, Meeting will be placed on TBA status (To Be Announced). Lincoln 10 is a very active camp, so information exchange will take place at event gatherings, and by email & snail mail.

***SOUP CROCK: “SWEET APPLE SOUP”,- *4 - tbs of Pearl Barley, 1 - 1/2 lbs of LB Apples, 2 oz of Sugar, 3/4 tbs of thick Cream, 1-qt of Water. Put the barley in the water and bring to a boil. While water is heating peel and slice up apples. A dozen should be enough unless they are very wormy and withered , then use two dozen or as needed. Adds the sliced apples and continue cooking gently until the barley and apples are soft. Press through a sieve, or mash madly with pestle or whatever comes to hand, and put back in the saucepan. Add the sugar and lemon juice and bring to a boil again. Remove from the heat , allow to cool, and then chill. Serve cool with the cream stirred in. Avery fine dish for the sick or wounded as well as the hale and healthy.**

Saloon Solutions: “Persencia”: * 14 lb of raisins, 1-Gallon of Milk, 10 – Gallons of water, Peel of 1 – Lemon, 1 to 2 – whole lemons, Sugar, Cloves. Take a stone { an old English measurement of 14 pounds } of Maligo Raisins, pick / wash & stomp them. Then bring to boil 10 – gallons of water, and put in the raisins. Let it stand for two hours. Then boil it again. And after standing for an hour, “Strain” in to tub. The next day , clear it into a runlet {stone or glass vessel}, and mix it in with four quarts of fresh milk, then rock and shake it for an hour to hour and half. Then put in a lemon or two – sliced. And a rind of one. Stop up the runlet, and after 14 – days , BOTTLE IT with a pinch of cloves and sugar to each bottle.

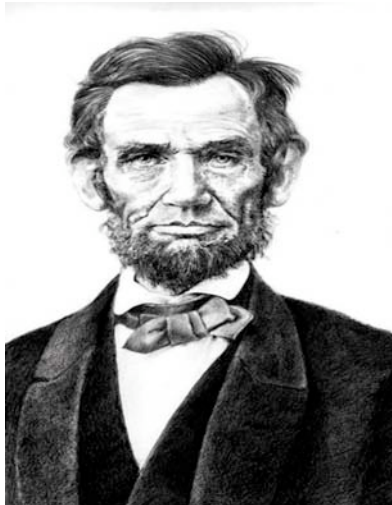
