* **COOKS CORNER: "GREEN TURTLE SOUP"**, - * 2-lb. green turtle meat, 2-QT Water, 3 eggs (hard boiled), ¼ whole Lemon, 1 gill Sherry Wine. Two pounds of turtle add two quarts of water, put to boil on a slow fire and cook down to three pints. Season while boiling with pepper & salt to taste. Take three hard boiled eggs, slice very thin and lay in tureen: slice one fourth of a lemon and put in tureen also . Then pour in tureen one gill of Sherry Wine. Then pour hot soup and send it to the Table. Quantity for a dozen guests.

Saloon Solutions: "Stone fence": * 1 wine glass [about ¾ c.] Bourbon Whiskey. Sweet Cider, - Add the whiskey and two or three lumps of ice to a large bar glass . Fill up the glass with the sweet cider and serve.

DEPARTMENT ORDER No. 9 Series 2008-2009

PASSING OF BROTHER Marvin McPherson Shaw

By the authority vested in me as Commander of the Department of California and Pacific, by the Department Bylaws, the National Constitution and Regulations, and National Policies, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1: It is my sad duty to report: On November 29, 2008, Brother Marvin McPherson Shaw, of the Abraham Lincoln Camp 10, passed away. Brother Shaw served this Order since 2002, and had been Camp 10's Patriotic Instructor for the past 3 years. His ancestor was Capt, Columbus Dillon of the 7th Iowa Infantry. All that knew him know he leaves a void that can never be filled both in our Order and our lives.

Section 2: The Department and all Camp Charters are to be draped in black for a period of thirty (30) days.

Section 3: All Department Brothers are respectfully directed to attach a black mourning ribbon to their membership badge (pursuant to C&R, Article III, Sec. 9) for a period of thirty (30) days.

Section 4: The Department of California and Pacific extends its sincere condolences to the family of Brother Shaw and to the Brothers of his Camp.

The foregoing Department Order is proclaimed this 6th day of December in the year of our Lord Two Thousand Eight, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred thirty-second, in the Town of Fallbrook, County of San Diego, State of California by Jerry R. Sayre, Commander of the Department of California and Pacific, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War.

Marvin McPherson Shaw: was born in Superior, Nebraska, on July 21st, 1930, he was a farm boy that grew up in Nebraska attending small local schools while working on the family farm. Brother Shaw graduated from high school about 1949 and during the Korean War, joined the United States Navy. Brother Shaw was trained as a Hospital corpsman and later served with the Marine corps as a corpsman, during his 8 year service he married his wife Jennette who was a nurse from Santa Cruz. Marvin Shaw left service after his enlistment expired, he and his wife & two daughters moved to Santa Cruz, where he worked for "Long Star Cement"- Plantronic's and as a landscaper/Gardner in Los Gatos. During his working years, he remained active in the Naval reserve and retired after 20plus years as a Hospital corpsman 1st class. Brother Shaw joined the "American Legion" in the early 1990's and served in most offices including about 6 years as its commander in Santa Cruz. Brother Shaw served as a Officer for the "United Veterans Council ". At the time of his death he was serving as Adjutant for "American Legion Post # 64". Marvin Shaw promoted actively in programs involving Junior High and High Schools, the Flag Program for the local Elks Lodge, Participating in Parades and other Patriotic events, and participated devoutly to the "4 Chaplain Services" at Fort Ord and the 194 Tank Battalion Memorial in Salinas. Brother Shaw came from a long tradition of family Military service stretching back to the Revolutionary War. He was active in the "Sons of the American Revolution" and the "Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War", his Civil War Ancestor was: Captain Columbus D. Dillen, enlisted as a Private in Company G of the 7th Iowa Infantry in 1861 and was discharged with the rank of Captain in 1865. Brother Marvin Shaw was attached to Camp Abraham Lincoln 10 in 2002, served one year as Junior Vice Commander, and 4 years as Patriotic Instructor. He was a devoted in his participation at the Flag Ceremonies at the Memorial Day Ceremonies at Evergreen Cemetery in Santa Cruz. He indeed participated at the 2008 Memorial Day event at the cemetery, months later he succumbed to a stroke, and his condition became worse and passed away on November 29th, 2008. His presence will be missed.
