


Commander Gary Parrott marching with the Comstock Civil War Reenactors.

On November 11, 2005, members of the William Passmore Carlin Camp No. 25 assembled at the Lone Mountain Cemetery in Carson City, Nevada, to participate in a special Veterans Day Memorial Service to honor the Civil War Veterans interred there. This was the third year that Carlin Camp No. 25 has held services at the Grand Army of the Republic Custer Post 5 plot of the cemetery on Veterans Day. Present during this special ceremony were several members of Camp No. 25, Allied Orders and the general public. The Opening Ceremony of the memorial service included a Welcome and Introduction, the Posting of the Colors, a Prayer and "Pledge of Allegiance". The Memorial Service portion of the ceremony contained a special GAR Remembrance, a Roll Call (a reading of the names of all the known Union Veterans interred at the Lone Mountain Cemetery), a Military Salute and a special GAR Postlude. The highlight of the service was the placing a floral wreath at the base of the GAR Civil War Monument. Representing the SUVCW - General William P. Carlin Camp were: Gary Parrott (Camp Commander), Paul Washeleski (Sr. Vice Commander and PCC), Brian Worcester (Camp

Secretary-Treasurer), David A. Davis (Camp Historian) and his son - Tyrone. Also present were: Lori Parrott (Auxiliary to the SUVCW-Dr. Mary E. Walker No. 52) and Janice Frost (Thomas Holcomb Chapter of the Society of Colonial Dames of the XVII Century). It should be noted, the Lone Mountain Cemetery has the largest assemblage of Civil War Union Veterans in Nevada, including over 40 Unknown Soldiers.
