I visited Oahu, HI during January 2013 and some Civil War GAR sites. The Grand Army of the Republic section at Oahu Cemetery: I met with historian Nanette Napoleon and explored some Civil War ideas, gathered and shared information on Native Hawaiians who served in the Civil War. The cemetery has a large number of soldiers and sailors buried there who served in the Civil War before moving to Hawaii also.











Grand Army of the Republic plot Hawaii GAR Post 45 with original cannon that has since vanished: Seems no one at the cemetery or town know where it is or what happened to it or the obelisk with the GAR 45 Post names. After discussing this with the Oahu Cemetery staff and historian Nanette Napoleon it is currently a mystery until we run across some facts, newspaper article or official record explaining their disappearance. On Jan. 28, 2013, I also located the long forgotten Armstrong Memorial at Punahou School. It is a large wall mounted Memorial plaque with his likeness but the patina is getting very dark. I notified the school archivist and the University of its Location.


