Minutes of the camp meeting

I). Opening

A). The meeting was called to order by Commander Dietrich at 1314 hours.

B). The Pledge of Allegiance was led by SVC David Davis.

C). Invocation was led by Chaplain Frank Whitman.

D). Members present in person: Richard Dalton, David Davis, Jay Dickey, Kurt Dietrich, David Hess, Roger Linscott, Robert Stoecklin, Frank Wood. Members present remotely: Frank Whitman. Guests: Randall C. Lorenz, (randallclorenz@yahoo.com) applying for membership by right of descent from Civil War Veteran Alexander Taylor.

II). Camp Commanders Report-- Camp Commander Kurt Dietrich A). Camp Commander Dietrich read Camp Order No. 2 noting the untimely passing of Brother Brian Worcester.

B). Commander Dietrich welcomed our guest, Randall Lorenz, and invited him to say a few words about his interest in the SUVCW and his Civil War ancestor.

III). Secretary's Report—-Secretary David Hess. General William Passmore Carlin--Camp 25 Department of California & Pacific The Minutes of the June meeting were previously reported to all members of Camp 25 via the Camp newsletter. Brother Hess asked if there were any additions or corrections. Being none, it was MOVED (Linscott) and SECONDED (Dalton) to approve the Minutes of the August meeting as submitted. The motion PASSED unanimously.

IV). Treasurer's Report—Treasurer David Hess.

1). Brother Hess presented the Financial Statement for Camp 25 for the period ended September 30. Hess asked if there were any questions/additions/corrections. It was MOVED (Linscott) and SECONDED (Dickey) to accept the Financial Statement for the period ending September 30, 2020 as submitted. The motion PASSED unanimously. [See EXHIBIT 1]

2). Brother Hess also provided an updated report on the current status of our pledge of \$500 to the Washoe Charters of Freedom project. The City rejected their proposal. At the moment they are looking for another site. At issue was whether to rescind our grant and redirect it to the GAR Monument Project. Hess mentioned that we have informed them of our commitment. Because they are still working on an alternative site it might be premature to withdraw our gift. There was general agreement to abide by our commitment until there is a material change. Hess said he will continue to monitor their progress.

3). Brother Hess said that dues notices would be going out soon. The Annual Dues is still \$38.00, and there will be another line for the optional \$3.00 dues for the SVR.

V). Senior Vice Commander Report Nothing to report.

VI). Historians Report. The Historians Report was emailed to members and is attached to these Minutes. [See EXHIBIT 2].

VII). Junior Vice Commander's Report. Nothing to report.

VIII). Patriotic Instructor's Report In the absence of Brother Tyrone Davis, there was no Patriotic Instructor's report.

IX). Grave Registration Officer Report—Brother Donald Huffman

X). Other Officers Reports—Nothing to report.

XI). New Business--All.

1). GAR Cemetery Monument Project: It has been noted that work is being done on the GAR Cemetery in Reno. The first is a new gate. We are told that along with the new gate will come fencing to match the gate around the entire GAR cemetery grounds. The second is a pay-to-park parking lot along the entire Angel Street side of the cemetery [refer to the Historian Report attached to these Minutes as Exhibit 2] It has been commented upon that the new gate bears a plaque that acknowledges contributors to the gate, but fails to mention anything about the Civil War Veterans who are buried there. Jay Dickey reported that he has looked into a couple options for rededicating the GAR Cemetery. The first is a brass plaque that would be mounted on the gate in a fashion similar to the plaque already in place. The bid for that is \$1300 to \$1500. A new stone monument similar to but greatly improving upon the one already there [see Exhibit 3] that was installed by the DUVCW, would run about \$2111 plus installation. [see Exhibit 4] The members present were unanimous in their support for the stone monument. The next question was how to pay for it. Brother Dickey said he was hopeful that the Community Foundation of Western Nevada (CFWN) would put up \$1000 if the Camp could come up with the balance. At that, pledges of \$100 each were made by Brothers Hess, Linscott, Dietrich, Dalton, and Whitman. In addition, \$500 was pledged by Brother Stoecklin. It was agreed by all, that, assuming the funds from the CFWN would be forthcoming, there was sufficient funds to proceed. Brother Dickey was authorized to proceed with negotiating the details with the vendor.

XII). Old Business--All.

1). Brother Jay Dickey agreed to serve as Camp 25 Counselor. [See Exhibit 5]

2). Commander Dietrich listed the cancellation of all Fall events. This includes the Wreaths Across America event at the VA Cemetery in Fernley. All agreed to gather at the GAR Cemetery in Reno to commemorate the Wreaths Across America event there.

3). There was a long discussion about the ownership status of the cemetery. Currently, the ownership of the cemetery is uncertain as the last organization to which title was passed is no longer in existence. Custodianship of the cemetery has been for a long time been claimed by the American Legion Post 1. Discussions by Brothers Dietrich and Dickey with the Department Commander and Counsel have been generally supportive but have stopped short of an endorsement. Issues to be resolved include: 1. Should we seek title? 2. If we seek title how should we go about it? 3. Who has financial responsibility and what are those responsibilities? 4. How will we cover any liability we might incur? 5. How to open the discussion with the American Legion? The answer to #1 will be made by the full membership. In order to do that Commander Dietrich and Brother Dickey will continue the discussion with the Department Commander and Counselor to answer questions #2 and #3. Once we have a clear path on how to proceed we will look into question 4 (liability insurance). Commander Dietrich will contact Past Commander Ed Carson to discuss how we should approach the American Legion (question #5). [see EXHIBIT 6 for copies of title transfers]

XIII). The closing prayer was offered by Chaplain Frank Whitman.

XIV). The meeting was adjourned at 1520 hours. The date of the next meeting was set for Sunday, DECEMBER 20th at 1300 at the VFW Hall.

HISTORY AND MEMORIALS REPORT

October 18, 2020

David A. Davis, Gen. William Passmore Carlin Camp 25 Camp Historian/Civil War Memorials Officer.

HILLSIDE CEMETERY PAVED LOT

Drew Lawton, proprietor of Sierra Memorial Gardens and owner of the Hillside Cemetery (or about 1.9 acres of what it originally was), had the strip of land between the G.A.R. General O.M. Mitchel Post 69 cemetery plot paved and turned into a pay to park lot. The land is part of Hillside Cemetery and therefore owned by Mr. Lawton. However, no one has been buried there. Part of the recently erected 6-foot fence across the front of the Post 69 cemetery has been removed and replaced with some temporary fencing. The fence posts had been pulled up and the old fencing rolled up and left. The fencing is supposed to be replaced with upgraded fencing more in style with the new Post 69 cemetery gate. At least one parking spot was supposed to be left open for visitors to the Post 69 cemetery, though none of the parking spots are marked as such. A plethora of warning signs are also posted. American Legion Post 1 and the Hillside Cemetery Preservation Foundation are aware of the parking lot.





GEN. O.M. MITCHEL POST 69

I started a spreadsheet of officers of the General O.M. Mitchel Post 69 officers. To date, the data is coming from the newspapers which usually lists the commander and adjutant at some event notice, but for some years most of the officers are listed in an installation service.

On another note, while visiting the Post 69 cemetery today and talking to Fran Tryon of the Hillside Cemetery Preservation Foundation, she pointed out the Post 69 cemetery has a useable water line, though it is normally turned off.

NEVADA DEPT. OF VETERANS SERVICES

As noted in the last Historian's report, Chuck Baker of the Nevada Department of Veterans Services (NDVS) in Las Vegas contacted our Graves Registration Officer, Don Huffman, about any information we may have on Civil War memorials in and around Gardnerville. He was developing a project to locate, research the history of, and obtain photographs of each and every veterans memorial in the State of Nevada. The information will go on the NDVS website so that anyone who wants to learn about and/or visit any of Nevada's memorials can see the photos and learn the locations of the memorials. He recently sent me a simple form to fill, though it asks for pictures and some back ground history.
