GAR ALTAR SAVED

Through the efforts of Sister **SHARON POPE** of Dr. Mary E. Walker Auxiliary No. 52 and her husband, Brother **BILL POPE** of Phil Sheridan Camp No. 4, the Camp has obtained an historic altar from the McKinley Post No. 187 of the Grand Army of the Republic (G.A.R.).

Upon its demise, the G.A.R. Post, which was based in Palo Alto, California, apparently left the Altar and a few other items to the local American Legion Post. Recently the American Legion Post was cleaning house and decided it was time for the property to go. The Popes were contacted to see if anyone would be interested in the items, which were going to be tossed out if no new home could be found.

The four corners of the altar resemble rifle stocks, while each of the four sides features an emblem representing a branch of the service — cannons for artillery, rifles for infantry, sabers for

cavalry, and an anchor for the navy. Inside the altar is space to store a Bible, altar cloth, ritual books, etc., which can be secured with a locking door.

Also recovered were some photos of Post members, which unfortunately were not identified.

Remembrance Day

November 19, 1863 was the date of the dedication of the new Soldiers' National Cemetery in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. During the ceremonies President Abraham Lincoln delivered his famous Gettysburg Address. The anniversary of these events is now known as Remembrance Day and is observed annually by members of the Allied Orders.

Unfortunately, the Remembrance Day activities originally scheduled for Oak Hill Memorial Park in San José on November 20th were cancelled on account of rain. However, the Camp and Auxiliary still participated in Remembrance Day.

Brother TAD D. CAMPBELL, PDC and Sister RACHELLE M. CAMPBELL, PDP participated in the 54th Annual Remembrance Day Parade in Gettysburg. The event featured several thousand participants in period attire. The day began with a Sons of Veterans Reserve (SVR) breakfast, then a ceremony at the G.A.R. (Woolson) Monument at Ziegler's Grove, followed by the parade. In the evening a grand ball was held, from which all the proceeds annually are given to the National Park Service.



Thomas Starr King

eenhe orator who saved the Union?

Thomas Starr King was born December 17, 1824, in New York City to Thomas and Susan (Starr) King. The sole support of his family at age 15, he was forced to leave school. Inspired by men like Ralph Waldo Emerson and Henry Ward Beecher, King embarked on a program of self-study for the ministry. At the age of 20 he took over his father's former pulpit at the Charlestown Universalist Church in Charlestown, Massachusetts.

In 1849 he was appointed pastor of the Hollis Street Church in Boston, where he became one of the most famous preachers in New England. He vacationed in the White Mountains of New Hampshire and in 1859 published a book about the area entitled *The White Hills: their Lagrander Landscape*



about the area entitled *The White Hills; their Legends, Landscapes, & Poetry.* In 1860 he accepted a call from the First Unitarian Church of San Francisco, California.

King's younger brother, Capt. Edward S. King, served as captain of the clipper ship *Syren*. Capt. King arrived in San Francisco aboard *Syren* just two days after his elder brother's stirring 1861 speech about Washington and the Union, remarking, "[Thomas] has the brains of the family, and I the brawn."

During the Civil War, King spoke zealously in favor of the Union and was credited by Abraham Lincoln with preventing California from becoming a separate republic. In addition, he organized the Pacific Branch of the United States Sanitary Commission, which cared for wounded soldiers and was the predecessor to the American Red Cross. A fiery orator, he raised more than \$1.5 million for the Sanitary Commission headquarters in New York, one-fifth of the total contributions from all the states in the Union. The relentless lecture circuit exhausted him, and he died in San Francisco on March 4, 1864, of diphtheria.

Mountain peaks in the White Mountains and in Yosemite National Park are named in his honor. In 1941 the Starr King School for the Ministry, in Berkeley, California, was also renamed in his honor. King's church and tomb in San Francisco are designated historical monuments, and two streets in the city are named for him. There is also a statue of him in Golden Gate Park near the De Young Museum. There are schools throughout California named and dedicated to him, and a Masonic lodge founded in 1864 in Salem, Massachusetts also bears his name.

As part of honors originally paid to Rev. King, he was judged worthy of representing California in the National Statuary Hall Collection displayed in the United States Capitol. In 1913 King was voted one of California's two greatest heroes and funds were appropriated for a statue. In 1931, the memorial was completed when the state of California donated a bronze statue of King to the national collection. The statue was mounted in the Capitol's Statuary Hall.

On August 31, 2006, however, the California Legislature approved a joint resolution to replace Thomas Starr King's statue in the National Statuary Hall Collection with a statue of Ronald Reagan. As a result of this resolution, King's statue has been removed from Statuary Hall and replaced with one of the former President.

King's statue was reinstalled within the Civil War Memorial Grove in Capitol Park, which surrounds the California State Capitol in Sacramento in November 2009, and was formally dedicated in a ceremony held on December 8th.

Did You Know?

December 1862

The Battle of Fredericksburg would unfold in a natural amphitheater bounded on the east by the Rappahannock River and on the west by the line of hills fortified by General Robert E. Lee. When Jackson's men arrived from downstream, CSA General Longstreet sidled his corps to the north, defending roughly five miles of Lee's front. He mounted guns at Strong points such as Taylor's Hill, Marye's Heights, Howison Hill, and Telegraph (later Lee's) Hill, the Confederate command post. "Old Pete's" five divisions of infantry supported his artillery at the base of the slopes.

On November 14, 1862, Union General Burnside, now in command of the Army of the Potomac, sent a corps to occupy the vicinity of Falmouth near Fredericksburg. The rest of the army soon followed. General Lee reacted by entrenching his army on the heights behind the town.

On December 11, Union engineers laid five pontoon bridges across the Rappahannock under fire.

On the 12th, the Federal army crossed over, and on December 13, Burnside mounted a series of futile frontal assaults on Prospect Hill and Marye's Heights that resulted in staggering casualties.

General Meade's division, on the Union left flank, briefly penetrated Stonewall Jackson's line but was driven back by a counterattack. Union generals C. Feger Jackson and George Bayard, and Confederate generals Thomas R.R. Cobb and Maxey Gregg were killed.

SUVCW Membership Eligibility

A male descendant, whether through lineal (direct ancestor) or collateral line (uncle) and not less than 14 years of age (6 to 14 years for Juniors), who: (1) is a blood relative (descendant or nephew) of a Soldier, Sailor, Marine or member of the Revenue Cutter Service, who was regularly mustered and served honorably in, was honorably discharged from or died in the service of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps or Revenue Cutter Service of the United States of America or in such state regiments called to active service and was subject to orders of United States general officers, between April 12, 1861 and April 9, 1865; (2) has never been convicted of any infamous or heinous crime and (3) has, or whose ancestor through whom membership is claimed has, never voluntarily borne arms against the government of the United States.
