



Did You Know?

150 Years Ago — 1863

- March 3 The U. S. Congress establishes the position of Chief Signal Officer, the beginning of the Signal Corps. Almost 3,000 men will serve in the corps during the war.
- March 9 A Confederate raid led by Captain John S. Mosby swoops in on Fairfax Courthouse, Virginia, capturing Union General Edwin Stoughton in his nightshirt. In addition to General Stoughton, there are 2 other officers and 30 enlisted men captured, as well as 58 horses. Supposedly when told of the raid, Lincoln said that he could always create another brigadier general, "...but those horses cost \$125 apiece!"
- **April 1** The first United States conscription (draft) law takes effect.
- April 17 Colonel Benjamin Grierson leads his Union cavalry out of LaGrange, Tennessee. In the next 16 days they will cover more than 600 miles, all the way to Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The raid is incredibly successful as the swiftly moving troopers destroy railroads and telegraph lines, capture more than 500 men, 1,000 mules and horses, and capture or destroy huge amounts of stores. It also distracts the attention of the Confederates from the growing Union threat to Vicksburg.
- **April 30** The Battle of Chancellorsville (Spotsylvania County, Virginia) begins.

SUVCW Membership Eligibility

A male descendant, whether through lineal (direct ancestor) or collateral line (uncle) and not less than 14 years of age (6 to 14 years for Juniors), who: (1) is a blood relative (descendant or nephew) of a Soldier, Sailor, Marine or member of the Revenue Cutter Service, who was regularly mustered and served honorably in, was honorably discharged from or died in the service of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps or Revenue Cutter Service of the United States of America or in such state regiments called to active service and was subject to orders of United States general officers, between April 12, 1861 and April 9, 1865; (2) has never been convicted of any infamous or heinous crime and (3) has, or whose ancestor
