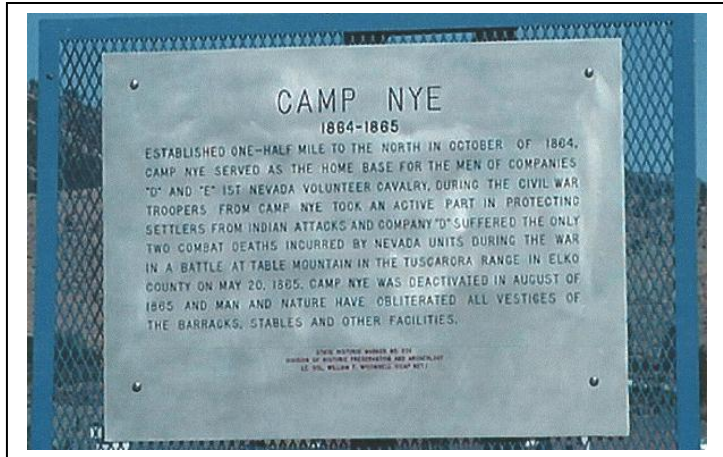

**Notes:**  
Inscription:  
“Established one-half mile to the north in October of 1864, Camp Nye served as the home base for the men of Companies D and E, 1<sup>st</sup> Nevada Volunteer Cavalry, during the Civil War. Troopers from Camp Nye took an active part in protecting settlers from Indian attacks and Company D suffered the only two combat deaths incurred by Nevada units during the war in a Battle at Table Mountain in the Tuscarora Range in Elko County in May 20, 1865. Camp Nye was deactivated in August of 1865 and man and nature have obliterated all vestiges of the barracks, stables and other facilities.”

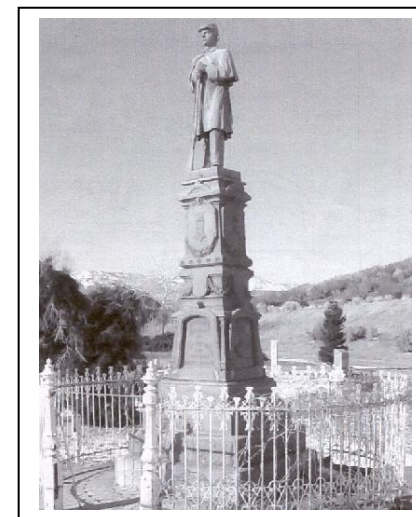

**Type:**  
 Statue of soldier on ornate pedestal. Hollow, “white bronze” zinc alloy, manufactured by Monumental Bronze Company of Bridgeport, CT. Stands 17 feet tall, consisting of six sections: Statue; upper, middle and lower dies, plinth, and two base blocks.

**Notes:**  
 Constructed on 27 May 1891 and dedicated on Memorial Day 1891. It is the only monument of its kind in the state of Nevada. Associated with General George Custer Post, No. 5, GAR.  
 Restored in 2004 by Carlin Camp #25 with the aid of a \$1,000 Special Awards Grant from the Memorial Grant Committee of the SUVCW. Repairs included reinforcing the interior with stainless steel and cavities filled with cement. Rededicated 11 November 2004.  
 Inscription on lower die (south side):  

NEVADA’S TRIBUTE TO UNION SOLDIERS AND SAILORS, MARCH 19, 1891

 A bas relief depiction of Admiral Farragut appears on the east side of the lower die.  
 A pamphlet entitled, *Grand Army of the Republic Civil War Monument, Lone Mountain Cemetery, Carson City, Nevada* was compiled by Gen. William Passmore Carlin Camp #25 in 2004. Copies are on file in the Department of California & Pacific. It includes history and restoration information on the monument.
