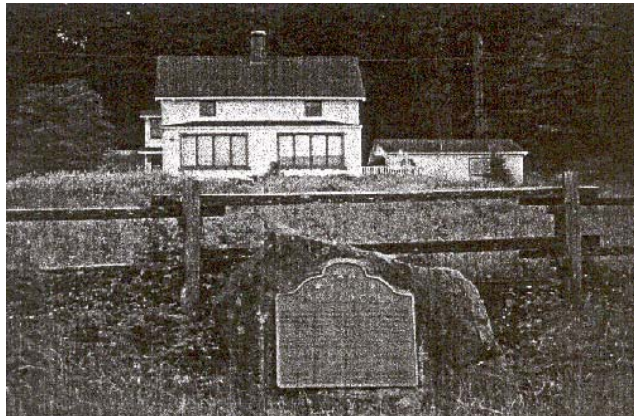

CAMP LINCOLN - A UNITED STATES MILITARY POST WAS ESTABLISHED | HERE SEPTEMBER 12, 1862 BY THE MEN OF COMPANY | G, 2ND REGIMENT, INFANTRY,
CALIFORNIA VOLUNTEERS, | TO KEEP PEACE BETWEEN THE INDIANA AND THE MINERS | AND SETTLERS OF NORTHWESTERN CALIFORNIA. IT | WAS ABANDONED IN
MAY 1870. COMMANDING OFFICERS | QUARTERS AND ONE BARRACKS REMAIN AT THE DATE | OF DEDICATION OF THIS SITE.

Inscription: FORT TERWER – SITE OF FORT TERWER, UNITED STATES MILITARY POST ESTABLISHED OCTOBER 12, 1857, BY FIRST LIEUTENANT GEORGE CROOK AND MEN OF COMPANY D TO KEEP PEACE BETWEEN THE INDIANS AND WHITES. THE FORT WAS DESTROYED BY A FLOOD IN DECEMBER, 1861, AND ABANDONED JUNE 10, 1862.
