 Located in a triangular park along Ala Malama Street at Puali Place, across from the U. S. Post Office, downtown.

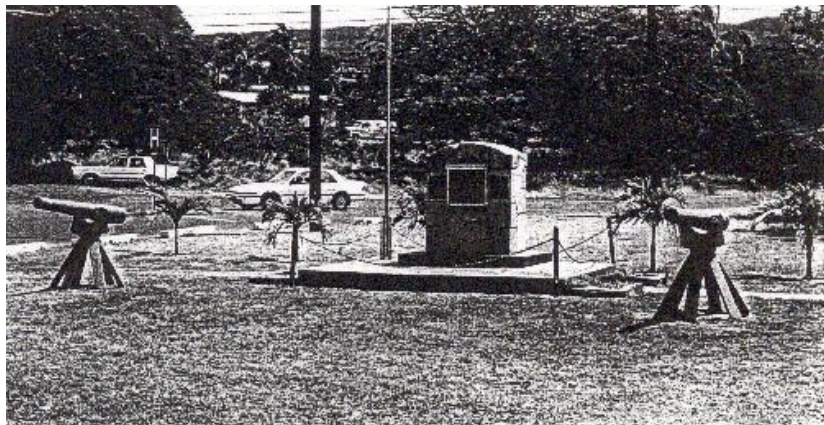
**Type:**  
 Two Model 1861 3-inch Ordnance Rifles.

- Registry #105, foundry Phoenix, inspector TTSL [Theodore Thaddeus Sobieski Laidley], foundry #115 (inferred), cast 1861, weight 819 pounds (inferred), rifling 7 grooves right hand. Altered to salute gun, registry no. uncertain.
- Registry #898, foundry Phoenix, inspector SCL [Stephen Carr Lyford], foundry #961 (inferred), cast 1865, weight 816 pounds (inferred), rifling 7 grooves right hand. Altered to salute gun, registry no. uncertain.

 Part of a set of six sent to Hawaii by the government. Two other pieces were once reportedly on display in front of a National Guard armory in Honolulu, Oahu. The location of the other two is not known.

The cannon display is associated with a monument erected by the Veterans of Foreign Wars and American Legion, dedicated to those Molokai residents killed in WW-II, Korea and Vietnam.

A full Form CWM-61 is not on file, only correspondence and photos from the 1999 investigations.
