

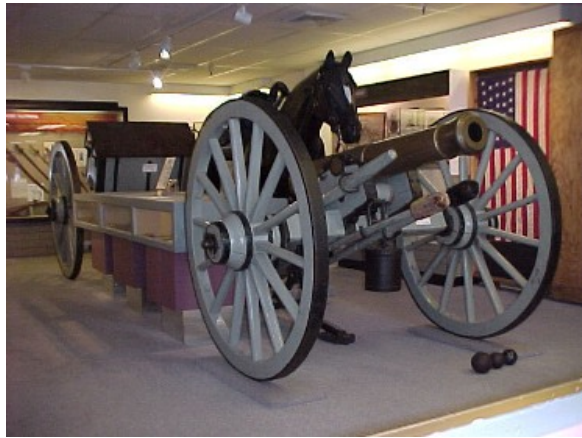

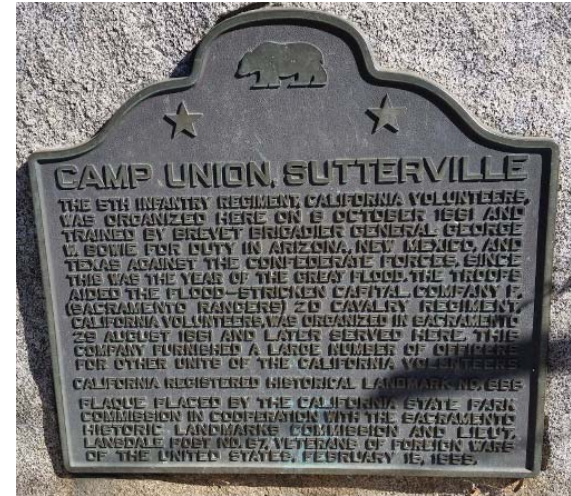

Simmons acting privately. At the dedication ceremony, the Liberty Pole was officially conveyed to the City by Lt-Col. H. Weinstock representing the Grand Army of the Republic.</p>	

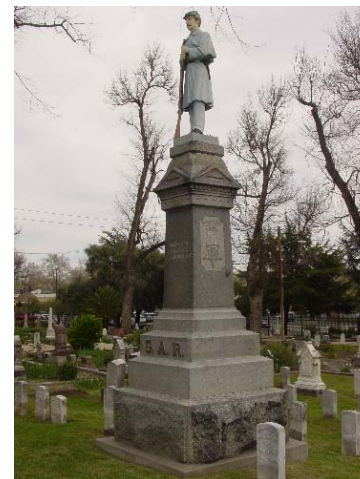
