**Notes:**  
Tall, 25-30', steel pipe flag pole with large ball at top. The ball is canted. Flag pole has been out of service for many years. Octagonal cement base, cracking from age, about 3' in. width at tapered base. Pole rusting. Sets in the internal paved road, north edge, running east and west, between rows 239 and 240 to the road side of the cement gutter (north side of mausoleum).

Small thin etched brass plaque, well aged and screws need replacing, on the south side of the cement base reads:

<b>Notes:</b> Found wrapped in newspaper in the Courthouse basement circa 1985, then mounted in its current location.  The Woman's Relief Corps (WRC), auxiliary to the GAR, established a practice of presenting plaques such as this to county courthouses, schools, civic auditoriums, etc., especially during years when the Department Encampment was hosted in that community. Department Encampments were held in Santa Barbara in 1907, 1920 and 1936. First mention of this type of plaque in the Department of California and Nevada was in 1927, so the plaque may be associated with the 1936 encampment. Two types of plaque were recommended for placement by local Corps: The Gettysburg Address or Gen. John A. Logan's General Order proclaiming Memorial Day.  Associated with Starr King Corps, No. 10, W.R.C., and Starr King Post, No. 52, G.A.R.	



<p><b>Notes:</b>                      Delivered to Starr King Post, No. 52, GAR, based in Santa Barbara in 1900, under the provisions an Act of Congress approved 22 May 1896. In the 1900 Annual Report of the War Department Chief of Ordnance, the cannon was noted as having been ordered on 6 June 1900, under letter number 34109 with 3 enclosures. The cannon was delivered from Benicia Arsenal, and was one of two 30-pounder Parrotts delivered to Santa Barbara. Accompanying the order was a set of forty 8-inch “shell” (cannon balls).</p> <p>A concrete “monkey” (triangular rack) designed to hold twenty cannon balls is placed to the cannon’s right. No cannon balls are present.</p> <p>It is said that this cannon and the cannon at Santa Barbara Cemetery were once displayed together. This gun was subsequently moved to its present location for unknown reasons.</p>
