This creed was adopted by the 38<sup>th</sup> National Encampment of the Sons of Veterans at Columbus, Ohio on 11 September 1919. Although it is no longer a formal part of the Ritual and Ceremonials, its sentiments endure to this day and link us to the GAR of honored memory.

# Special Committee to Explore the Possibility of Coordinating Joint Activities between the SUVCW/ASUVCW Department of California and Pacific and the Sons of Confederate Veterans California Division in 2020.

By the authority vested in me as Commander of the Department of California and Pacific, by the Department Bylaws, the National Constitution and Regulations, and National Policies, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1: Several years ago, the Special Committee to Explore the Possibility of Coordinating Meetings and/or Activities of the SCV California Division Convention and SUVCW/ASUVCW Department Encampment in 2020 was created. During its report at the 133rd Annual Department Encampment, on 23 March 2019, at Bakersfield, California, the Committee had no recommendations, but concluded it was unlikely such activities could be achieved in 2020. The committee was then discharged. Delegates unanimously requested the Department Commander for 2019-2020 appoint a special committee to further investigate possibilities of such activities in 2020 and future years

<u>Section 2</u>: I am hereby establishing the Special Committee to Explore the Possibility of Coordinating Joint Activities between the SUVCW/ASUVCW Department of California and Pacific and the Sons of Confederate Veterans California Division.

The purpose of this special committee is to examine the feasibility of conducting joint functions between the Department of California and Pacific, SUVCW/ASUVCW and the California Division of the Sons of Confederate Veterans during their respective state-level conventions in 2020 or for future conventions.

Section 3: This special committee shall:

- a) Serve through the close of business at the 134th Annual Department Encampment of the Department of California and Pacific, SUVCW, at which time it shall be discharged of its duties and cease to exist.
- b) No later than ninety (90) days after issuance of this Department Order, the Committee shall report to the Department Commander its findings and recommendations for the likelihood of joint SUVCW/SCV activities during the 2020 conventions.
- c) The Committee shall determine the practicality of pursuing the likelihood of joint SUVCW/SCV activities during future conventions after 2020.
- d) The final decision on whether to pursue the possibilities of joint SUVCW/SCV activities during future conventions shall be determined by the Department Senior Vice Commander, who shall report the Special Committee's findings and recommendations at the 134th Annual Department Encampment.

Section 4: I hereby appoint the following members to this special committee: Department Senior Vice Commander Frank C. Avila as chairman; Brothers Linn W. Malaznik and Steven H. Steinberg as members; Sisters Cindy Eddy (PAP) and Rachelle Campbell (PNP) to serve as ASUVCW liaisons to the special committee; and Sons of Confederate Veterans, California Division Chief of Staff Jon Fowler to serve as SCV liaison. As Department Commander, I will serve as an *ex officio* member of the special committee.
