Noted in the Journal of Proceedings of the 77th National Encampment, GAR, 1943, address of Commander-in-Chief John S. Dumser: "Another memorial tree was planted on July 25, at Anza Lake, near Berkeley, Calif. It is a sturdy baby redwood, *Sequoia gigantea*, presented by Lookout Mountain Corps, W.R.C.. Again I was asked to dedicate the living tree as a memorial to the Grand Army and place the first shovel of dirt around its balled root." Dumser was a resident of Oakland.


Notes:
There are two Giant Sequoia trees at this location. The plaque lies at the base of the northern of the two. The plaque is mounted on a beveled concrete base, which has been severely damaged (lower right corner broken off). The plaque itself is in good shape, bent slightly near the concrete damage.

Associated with the Berkeley Rose Garden and nearby Cordonices Park. The Rose Garden was dedicated on 26 September 1937, after several years of development as a WPA project. This plaque was placed less than two years after the opening of the garden, and in conjunction with the 72nd Annual Encampment of the Department of California & Nevada, GAR, convened in Berkeley at the Hotel Whitecotton. The Allied Orders of the GAR (SUVCW and Auxiliary, DUVCW, and WRC) were also present. Young – a 93 year old Oakland resident – was GAR Department Commander that year, but was unable to preside at the meetings due to ill health.

Memorial dedicated to Francis Reed Young (1845-1940), Commander of the GAR Department of California & Nevada for 1938-39. A typographic error was cast into the plaque giving the initials "T. R." instead of "F. R." Inscription:
IN HONOR OF | T. R. YOUNG | DEPARTMENT COMMANDER | GRAND ARMY OF | THE REPUBLIC | CALF. AND NEVADA | MAY 1, 1939

A memorial bench in memory of the GAR dead, was presented to the City of Berkeley by the Daughters of Union Veterans at the same encampment. Its location is not currently known.

Decorative elements include two cannons (see case files below), a flag pole, and cannon balls placed as finials atop columns at the plot corners and entrances. A 1904 photograph reveals that the entire plot was once enclosed by concrete curbing with cannon balls set in it. Many of the latter have been removed, leaving depressions in the curb.

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Notes:
Associated with the Veterans' League of Hayward (organized November 1894). The Lone Tree Cemetery Association approved the transfer of the plot to the Veterans' League in August 1901, and the ground was officially deeded on 24 October 1901. A flagpole was installed in late April or early May 1902, and dedicated along with the plot on 30 May 1902. Cannons and other decorative elements were added between September 1902 and December 1903.




Notes:
 "The cannon was used in the Civil War days to announce Union victories. Subsequently it was used as a Fourth of July cannon" (source: *Oakland Tribune*, 19 April 1905). It was ordered by the City Council to be placed in City Hall Park in 1905, opposite the City Jail, after having been used as a hitching post and neglected as a piece of scrap iron. The cannon, a carronade, was once on board a vessel called the *John Jay*.

In 1873 it was described as being a "rusty old six-pounder which has lain for years within 20 or 30 feet of the sidewalk on Washington Square." It was used as a signal gun, purchased by squatters from a sea captain who had brought it around the Horn, to sound the alarm in the event parties showed up to forcibly evict them. Hence, the name "Squatter Cannon." This story relates to the squatter disputes in the vicinity in the early 1850's. The gun is said to have been brought to Oakland in 1852.

Another cannon, reportedly captured by Admiral Dewey from Manila during the Spanish-American War, was also on display on the Old City Hall Square. It was reportedly removed to Independence Square in East Oakland per resolution of the Board of Supervisors in 1907 (source: splashpad.org).

<p>Notes: Placed by the "Women and Girl Workers of '61 and '65 in memory of the Civil War, Spanish War and World War veterans who gave their lives that liberty shall not perish." The bust was reportedly originally placed in a triangular plot of land near Lake Merritt in June 1920. It was part of a Civil War memorial reportedly donated to the City of Oakland by Annie (Hunley) Glud, a female veteran of the Union Army. Other decorative elements in the original memorial included a flag, bust of U.S. Grant, two Civil War cannons, a drinking fountain, benches and "lovely plants." The memorial was reportedly removed when a nearby freeway was constructed (I-580?). Although the history is unclear, the bust was eventually relocated to Fallon Street, on the sidewalk directly across from the steps of the Alameda County Courthouse. A speeding car collided with the statue in December 2012, destroying the pedestal. 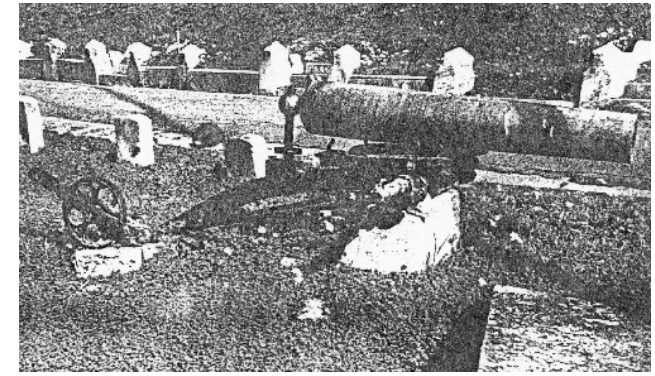

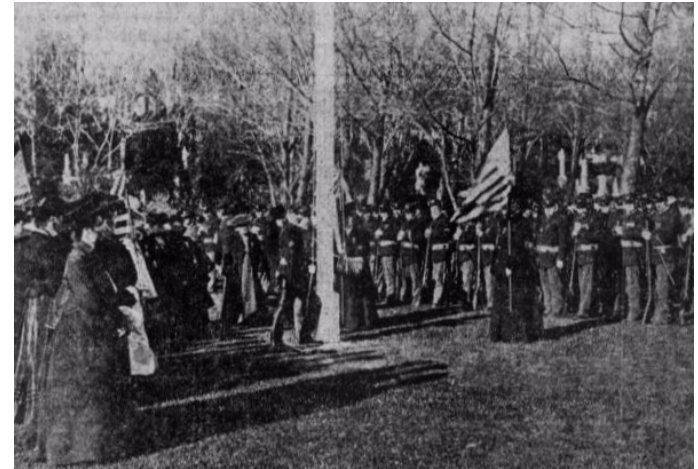

The base was consecrated with soil from battlefields at Lexington and Bunker Hill, and from the tombs of Washington, Lincoln, Grant, Jackson, Garfield, Scott, Logan and others, as well as from the graves of John Hancock, Samuel Adams, Robert Treat Paine, Paul Revere, Peter Faneuil, and William McKinley.

O'Brien served in the Civil War as a 2LT in Co. D of the 134th Illinois Infantry. Moving to Washington after the war, he organized the first National Guard company there, and was eventually awarded the rank of Brigadier General there. He was an active member of the GAR and Military Order of the Loyal Legion of the United States (MOLLUS). In 1893, as a member of the Washington Commandery of MOLLUS, he presented a resolution urging the membership to immediately stand and uncover whenever the National Anthem is played. In later years, he was associated with Appomattox Post, No. 50, GAR, based in Oakland.

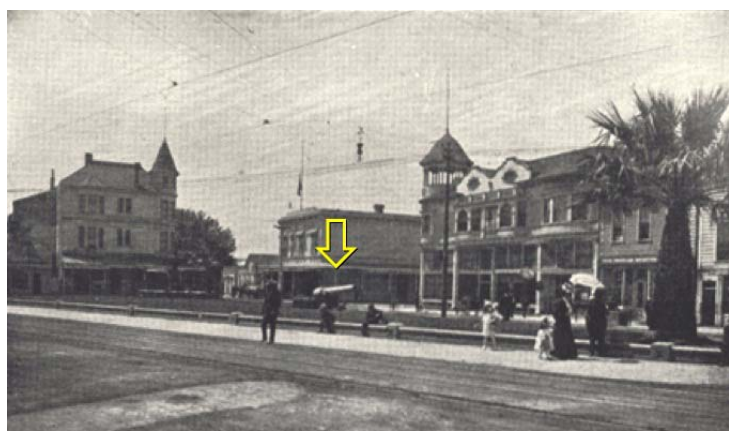
