Probably one of two cannons authorized by Congress to be delivered to Fresno: "To the city of Fresno, California, two condemned cannon, with suitable outfit of cannon balls." (64th Congress, Sess. I, Chap. 466, An Act Authorizing the Secretary of War to make certain donations of condemned cannon and cannon balls, Sept. 8, 1916, S. 6625, Public No. 274). One of these guns may have been originally mounted in the GAR Plot at Mountain View Cemetery.

Two-sided stone tablet with dedicatory text honoring Union and Confederate veterans on the opposing sides of the stone. Symbols include the Union shield on the US side, and the Southern Cross on the CS side.

Dedicated 27 May 2013, members of both the SUVCW and SCV participating. The monument was removed from the site on 19 August 2017, out of fear of vandalism in response to a critical editorial in a local newspaper. It is currently in the safekeeping of the Sons of Confederate Veterans.



Monument (concrete base), with carved stone plaques mounted on opposite sides, formerly with cannon. Includes a nearby flagpole.

Notes:

Dedicated 30 May 1917. Associated with Atlanta Post, No. 92, GAR; George A. Custer Circle, No. 18, Ladies of the GAR; Ida Saxton McKinley Tent No. 8, Daughters of Veterans; United Spanish War Veterans and USW Auxiliary. A cannon, which originally topped the monument, has been removed. Only the shackles that secured the trunnions remain. It may be one of the guns now in the collections of the Legion of Valor Museum. These guns were delivered to Fresno in 1916, which is when the gun topping this monument was reportedly delivered.

Notes:

Discovered by Joseph Harden in 1862. Named for Ulysses S. Grant in 1867 through the efforts of Mrs. Lucretia P. Baker. Became the National Christmas Tree in 1926, by President Calvin Coolidge. Also proclaimed a National Shrine for all men and women of the United States who have given their lives in service to their country, 1956, by President Dwight D. Eisenhower. No information in handouts. Described as the third largest tree in the world. It is also known as the "nation's Christmas tree."
