Erected by the Grand Army of the Republic and allied orders 1938</p> <p>After many years of neglect, the Woodlawn Cemetery is undergoing revitalization, thanks to the efforts of a non-profit cemetery revitalization organization called One Section At A Time (www.onesectionatatime.org/). Since organizing in 2020, One Section At A Time, in partnership with the Walker Family Events Foundation and other organizations, has rehabilitated and improved the GAR plot, as well as other sections of the cemetery. The cannon replica has been repainted, the aging steel flag pole replaced, and the grounds cleaned and maintained in a respectable manner. The new flag pole was rededicated at a public ceremony on 17 April 2021. In light of the many improvements made to the plot since the original assessment in 2005, we will make and post an updated assessment shortly.</p>

It was stolen from the cemetery in 1962 and recovered seven years later from a dump in San Pedro. The Wilmington Historical Society donated it to the Society for the Preservation of Drum Barracks, and it underwent restoration in time for the museum's opening in 1987. It now serves as the centerpiece of the museum's Civil War Technology Room."
