GAR Plot deeded 30 May 1883. Was first described in 1883 as a "green mound" in center of plot dedicated to the unknown soldier. In 1892 the mound was replaced by "shaft entwined with garlands and flowers." Later replaced by obelisk. Chain fence, stanchions and curbing added in 1897. The original wooden obelisk was replaced sometime after the 1930's.

The site is used annually for the community Memorial Day gathering.

The courthouse bell was used as a general alarm during the Civil War, and was the signal for the local militia companies to assemble.

Description from Lin Weber, Napa historian 2007:

"In pro-Union Napa, there was a bell located on top of the courthouse that rang to alert the town in case of trouble, and when the telegraph wires were cut during the Civil War it rang to gather the people to deliver the news of the day."

It is thought that the bell was eventually delivered to the Christian Brothers, and may currently be at the Mont LaSalle center in Napa. The cupola of the 1878 courthouse structure was removed in 1931, which was about the same time that the Mont LaSalle property came into being. This coincidence supports the possibility that the bell is there. The bell would have dated its use back to an earlier Courthouse structure built in 1857. Further research is necessary to confirm the story and location of this bell.

There are no inscriptions on the north facing side of the die. Michael Clark, in whose name the monument was dedicated, died in Jonesboro, Arkansas, on 27 March 1914. He was a Past Commander of Napa Post, No. 192, G.A.R. This monument was probably erected within a few years of his death.

"There was also a monument in the middle of Main at the junction of Spring called the 'Liberty Pole' that was put up right after the Civil War. It was a flagpole of some kind, and I'm told that it's been installed at the Vet's Home, although I've never found it. St. Helena had a large pro-south constituency, and I've always imagined they put the pole there to separate themselves from allegiance to the losing side."

This GAR plot was donated to St. Helena's Kilpatrick Post, No. 38, GAR, at a meeting of the Cemetery Association held on 1 April 1882. By Memorial Day 1882, a flag pole had been installed in the center of the plot and a concrete coping decorated with "Frear Stone" finials had been added around the perimeter. The ten finials, shaped to resemble small upturned cannon tubes, were positioned along the corners and sides of the perimeter coping. A concrete entry step with the initials "G.A.R." inscribed in it was also added.

Report from History of Department of California and Nevada, Woman's Relief Corps, 1883 to 1934, compiled by Ella M. French:

"Trees were planted commemorating George Washington, and honoring Department President Belle Lossing and Department Commander Arthur E. Vest, also a cannon, the gift of the Government at Mare Island to Appomattox Corps No. 5, was presented to the Veterans' Home at Yountville on June 17th, 1932. The inscription on the bronze tablet at base of cannon reads:

" 'Let us have Peace.' Dedicated in memory of the surrender of General Lee to General Grant at Appomattox, April 9th, 1865. Erected April 9th, 1932, by Appomattox Post and Corps. Dedicated June 17th, 1932."

The fountain was located in front of the "Lincoln Building" at the Veterans Home. It was dedicated by members of Lincoln Post, No. 1, GAR (San Francisco) and members of Lincoln Relief Corps, W.R.C., on 30 November 1930. The fountain was donated by these organizations, and large delegations from San Francisco were present at the ceremony. The dedication is noted in the Proceedings of the 1931 Department of California & Nevada Encampment (pg.62).

Lincoln Hall stands between The Alameda (parade ground) and the Veterans Home Post Office. This is presumably the same building.

In January 1897 the Veterans Home Association deeded the home and its 910 acres of land to the State, which has since maintained it.

Memorial Grove was first proposed by Frank F. Atkinson, a member of the Veterans Home board of directors, on 12 December 1927. The first tree was planted and dedicated on Memorial Day (30 May) 1928.

On Armistice Day 1929, a tree planting ceremony took place at the Grove, and a young tree was planted and dedicated for each veterans' organization representing the Civil War to World War I. The event was attended by G.A.R. DSVC John C. Chapman, accompanied by PDC Col. Russel C. Martin (from Los Angeles) and PDC Dr. S. W. Hopkins of Lodi. A tree was planted and dedicated to the Grand Army of the Republic during the ceremony.

The Grove is beautifully landscaped with many originally planted trees still surviving. Plaques crafted from various materials are distributed throughout the grove, honoring veterans of various wars. In interpretive kiosk a short distance inside the entrance gate displays a map of the Grove with key to the trees. The map is deteriorating, but still legible.

"Resolved, That the incoming Department administration be authorized to secure and place on a nearby granite boulder a proper bronze tablet, permanently recording these facts for future generations. Said bronze tablet cost not to exceed \$60."

The east-facing side of the monument represents the "front." Its base is decorated with a sculptural representation of a Civil War kepi with a belt and bayonet. The plinth is decorated with a sculptural eagle with wings outstretched, clasping an oak branch (strength and steadfastness) in its right talon, and an olive branch (desire for peace) in its left talon, while both talons clutching arrows (readiness for war) behind the branches.

The inscription on the north, south and west sides of the monument represent specific wars: Civil War, Spanish-American War, and Mexican War, respectively.
