OLD TEMESCAL ROAD | THIS ROUTE WAS USED BY LUISEÑO AND GABRIELÑO | INDIANS, WHOSE VILLAGES WERE NEAR BY. LEANDRO | SERRANO ESTABLISHED HERE THE FIRST HOME OF A | WHITE SETTLER IN RIVERSIDE COUNTY IN 1820. OVER | IT TRAVELLED JACKSON AND WARNER IN 1831, AND FREMONT IN 1849. IT WAS THE SOUTHERN EMIGRANT | ROAD FOR GOLD SEEKERS, 1849-1851; THE OVERLAND | MAIL ROUTE, 1858-1861; AND A MILITARY ROAD BETWEEN | LOS ANGELES AND SAN DIEGO, 1861-1865. | CALIFORNIA REGISTERED HISTORICAL LANDMARK NO. 638 | PLAQUE PLACED BY THE CALIFORNIA STATE PARK COMMISSION IN COOPERATION WITH THE WOMAN'S | IMPROVEMENT CLUB OF CORONA, MAY 9, 1959.

Masonry base only, original bronze plaque stolen. Replaced by a black granite tablet bearing the above inscription with the following change: Bronze Plaque Placed by the California State Park Commission | in cooperation with the Woman's Improvement Club of Corona | May 10, 1959 AND REPLACED IN 2013 WITH THIS GRANITE PLAQUE IN COOPERATION WITH GLEN IVY HOT SPRINGS.
