Notes:
NO. 963-1 CAMP CADY (ON THE MOJAVE ROAD) - Camp Cady was located on the Mojave Road which connected Los Angeles to Albuquerque. Non-Indian travel on this and the nearby Salt Lake Road was beset by Paiutes, Mohaves, and Chemehuevis defending their homeland. To protect both roads, Camp Cady was established by U.S. Dragoons in 1860. The main building was a stout mud redoubt. Improved camp structures were built 1/2 mile west in 1868. After peace was achieved, the military withdrew in 1871. This protection provided by Camp Cady enabled travelers, merchandise, and mail using both roads to boost California's economy and growth.

GAR monument consisting of life-sized copper statue of Union soldier standing at parade rest mounted atop a pyramidal stonework (mortared river rock) die. A flag pole is also associated with the monument.
A cannon tube is attached to the side of the stonework die: 3-inch Ordnance Rifle (M1861), Phoenix Foundry (P.I.Co.), Reg#: 782, Inspector Stephen Carr Lyford ("S.C.L"), Foundry#: (not known), year cast 1864, Weight 816 lbs., Rifling 7 RH

Notes:
Dedicated 30 May 1908, rededicated on Memorial Day 1953 by A. Podrasnik Camp #15 (Ontario), SUVCW. Due to repeated vandalism beginning in the 1970's, the statue suffered severe damage, including the loss of portions of the rifle and bayonet. It was placed in storage in 1988, and is currently in a temporary protected display in the entryway of the cemetery mausoleum. Inscription on plaque:

Notes: From the City of San Bernardino Parks website: "The 'Soldiers and Sailors Monument' in Pioneer Park at 6th and 'E' Streets was erected by a group of men who made up some of the last survivors from the Civil War. It was dedicated in April 1916, on the anniversary of General Robert E. Lee's surrender at Appomattox. The figure of a Civil War soldier stands atop the marble monument and on each of its four sides is a memorial to the soldiers and sailors who lost their lives in four different wars: the Revolutionary War, the Civil War, the Spanish American War and the Mexican War of 1847 when California became a part of the United States."

Notes: Octagon building designed in 1932 by architect Elmer Gray. Patio wings, along with fountains and limestone panels containing Lincoln quotations were added in 1937. The shrine was again expanded in 1998 with the addition of two wings. A gift to the community by Robert Watchorn (1858-1944).
