

#### Notes:

No information in handouts. Reported here due to Civil War interest. Turned over to the SCV for their files. Described by Davenport in 1949 as follows: "This large and almost unscarred Sequoia was dedicated to the memory of the Confederate leader by the Daughters of the Confederacy, and is situated on the Alta Trail a short distance above the McKinley Tree."

There are conflicting reports as to the origin of its name. While the above quoted passage credits the United Daughters of the Confederacy (UDC) with naming this tree, other sources credit the naming to Richard Field (a former Confederate officer) around 1875.



#### **Notes:**

U.S. Army Officer James Wolverton on 7 August 1879 named the tree in memory of his commanding officer in the Civil War.

Named in honor of General William Tecumseh Sherman in 1879 by James Wolverton, a naturalist who served as a lieutenant under Sherman in the Civil War.

### **Notes:**

Originally on display in the GAR Plot at Tulare Public Cemetery. It was removed and placed in storage when the spokes on the limber rotted and broke. The limber was located in a local barn in 2004 by local researcher, R. L. Hough.

The units were originally placed next to two 4.2-in. Parrott Rifles in the GAR plot, added after installation of the guns to honor World War I veterans.

Restoration was 70% complete in late April 2005.

### Notes:

One of a set of two Parrott Rifles installed as decorative elements in the GAR Plot managed by Gettysburg Post, No. 56. The guns arrived in Tulare from Benicia on 22 August 1904. This one was temporarily stored at the Southern Pacific Depot, while the other was set up in front of the office of Capt. Thomas H. Thompson. The guns were accompanied by a collection of "8-inch shells." The arrangements for the shipment were made by Capt. Thompson, with the intention of installing the items in the cemetery.

## Notes:

California Military Museum reports that a sign is posted at the corner of Race Avenue and North Santa Fe Street, and a second (unmarked) site is located at the corner of North Ben Maddox Way and Houston Avenue (Ivanhoe Drive).

A stone tablet, dedicated by Dr. Samuel Gregg George Chapter 1855 of E Clampus Vitus on 23 October 1993, provides a lengthy history of the site.

Another marker placed by the DUVCW exists at one of the sites (Susan Sweet, 2012).
